

Paul Armin Edelmann **Baritone**



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During his career Paul Armin Edelmann has been a guest at the **Vienna State Opera**, at the **Bregenz Festival**, at the **Komische Oper Berlin**, at **Teatro Real Madrid**, at the **Palau de les Arts Reina Sofia in Valencia**, at the **Teatro de la Maestranza in Seville**, at the music festival in **San Sebastián**, at **Théâtre de la Monnaie**, at the **Staatstheater Stuttgart**, at the **San Diego Opera**, the **New National Theatre Tokyo** or at the **Lincoln Center Festival in New York**.

He has performed as a recital and concert singer at the **Konzerthaus and Musikverein in Vienna**, the **Brucknerhaus in Linz**, the **Mozarteum in Salzburg**, at the **Cologne Philharmonic Hall**, at the **Philharmonie am Gasteig in Munich**, at the **Konzerthaus Dortmund** and at the **Philharmonie Luxembourg**. At the Vienna Konzerthaus he participated in the gala concert **“Christmas in Vienna”**.

Mr. Edelmann has worked under conductors such as N. Harnoncourt, L. Maazel, M. Plasson, I. Bolton or M. Honeck.

His first Solo Lied CD with songs by R. Schumann, his Johannes Brahms Lied album „Die schöne Magelone“ with Julia Stemberger and Charles Spencer or Max Regers Orchestral Songs with the Deutsche Staatsphilharmonie Rheinland-Pfalz under conductor Gregor Bühl have been released by Capriccio.
